- Once set you will see your child's/children's photo and be able to access the parent portal.

Some of you may not be able to access this if we do not have your correct email address. Please update this with the office as soon as possible. Where there is 1 family email address you can share your log in details with your partner and they will be able to access the app then.

Waimea Athletics - Important Information

Next Thursday (29th February) is Waimea Athletics, at the Riversdale Sports Grounds. The students have been out during the afternoons over the past couple of weeks learning the correct techniques. All students are expected to participate. Parents need to ensure that their child/ren are at the Riversdale Sports Grounds by 8:45 am, for a 9:00 am start.

*Senior Students Year (10, 11 and 12 year olds) running in the 1500m must be there by 8.30am.

Children assemble in front of their age group sign at 8.55am. Five and six year olds will be taken over to the Junior programme beside the hedge and other age groups will be taken to their first event.

You must let the bus driver know if your child is off the bus in the morning and afternoon.

Please arrive at the Riversdale Sports Grounds by 8.45am. Events start promptly at 9am.

TRANSPORT: You need to arrange transportation to and from Athletics Day. You do not need to come to school first. Parents/Caregivers, friends and whanau are encouraged to attend and support their child/ren if they are available. For any parents who cannot attend, buses will run as normal and drop children off at school. A staff member will stay at school until all buses have arrived to transport any bus children down to the Riversdale Sports Grounds. Please let us know if we will be expecting your child by bus on Athletics Day.


