Read to your children every night...

Reading to your child every night, right until they are in Year 8, is of huge benefit to them, and a lovely time for catching up with their day. Teaching professionals are noticing a big drop in the ability to concentrate, and book knowledge, in new entrant children. Corresponding to this is a drop in their oral language and general foundational skill levels – using scissors,



sitting on the mat for longer periods than 1 minute with attention, packing and unpacking their bags, holding a pencil correctly, counting numbers and forming the letters in their name from the correct start points.

Reading to children every night encourages the development of their attention, their oral language, and their knowledge and readiness for learning to read and write. It also develops a love of books. Thinking skills are developed, as while they listen, they are thinking about and discussing the meaning of the story, or some vocabulary. Their imagination is developed through listening to stories. It is a lovely bonding time, tucking children up into bed and relaxing and taking the time to read a story or the next chapter in the book. If you need any ideas for fabulous books to read, please get in touch with your children's teacher.

Please do not send sweets or chocolate treats (e.g., Freddo's) to school for



lunches – these can be after school treats. Also please check that your child is not bringing chewing gum to school. This gets dropped on carpets or stuck to school furniture. We have had a couple of incidents of senior children bringing gum to school lately. We love to see healthy, delicious food like

sandwiches, or a heat-up, and a small piece of fruit in lunches, as these sustain children for the afternoon learning session. Noodles must be managed by children and teachers are not expected to make these for children at school. If you wish to send them, please put them in a flask already prepared, or ensure that your child can deal with them.

Information for parents, whānau and caregivers

Reopening international borders and low immunisation rates, has increased the chances of disease outbreaks including measles. (Worldwide, reported measles cases increased by 79% in the first two months of 2022 compared to the same time last year.) Measles only occurs in New Zealand when it is brought into the country.

Measles is even more contagious than COVID and can be life-threatening to those who have not been vaccinated. It is important to be able to quickly identify anyone who might be at risk during an outbreak.



- Measles is preventable if you are fully vaccinated. If you're not sure you have been vaccinated against measles, it's best to get immunised.
- It is free for anyone born after 1969 who has not had two MMR vaccinations or if you don't have any proof of vaccination. There are no safety concerns with having additional MMR doses.
- You can get your MMR vaccinations at participating pharmacies, your GP or family doctor, the Dunedin Immunisation Centre, Civic Theatre Immunisation Centre in Invercargill and participating Maori and Pacific Health Care Providers.
